TCA 2007 Convention

Our 2007 Convention will be held in the Foundation House at Middle Tennessee State University on September 21 and 22. We invite colleagues from college, high school and professional ranks to attend and participate in the conference. Students are especially welcome.

The theme for this year's conference is *Experiential Learning*.

Experiential learning can best be described as that learning process that takes places beyond the traditional classroom and that enhances the personal and intellectual growth of the student. This education can occur in a wide variety of settings, but it usually takes on a learn-by-dong aspect that engages the student directly in the subject, work or service involved.

RANTA AND OSBORN WRITE ABOUT HISTORY OF SOUTHERN STATES COMMUNICATION ASSOCIATION

Richard R. Ranta, Dean of the College of Communication and Fine Arts at the University of Memphis and Michael Osborn, Professor Emeritus, University of Memphis presented a paper at the April 2006 convention of the Southern States Communication Association in Dallas, Texas that was published in the January/February 2007 issue of the *Southern Communication Journal* (Vol. 72, No.1).

The essay examines the controversies over changing the name that have arisen three

times in the history of the Southern States Communication Association (SSCA). The trajectory of these changes, the authors argue, has been toward wider, more inclusive professional identity for the field of communication, and for those affiliated with it.

The essay looks at how the latest of these changes occurred, as the authors lived through and participated in the contentious events of 1988 during the SSCA convention in Memphis.

2007 Jazz in June Radiothon

Raises Money for University of Memphis Radiostation

WUMR, U-92 FM, the University of Memphis radio station, just completed its Jazz in June bi-annual Radiothon. Thanks to a number of generous listener contributions and a tremendous kick-off event, the week-long fundraiser can once again be considered a success.

An Evening with Kirk Whalum and Friends at EP Delta Kitchen on Memphis' Beale Street, on the opening night of the Radiothon attracted about 500 Jazz Lovers who witnessed a terrific performance.

"It was an amazing night for the station," said U-92 Program Director Mark Bialek. "We knew Kirk Whalum is a world renowned Jazz artist with Memphis roots, but nobody thought we would sell 370 tickets in advance and have so many of our listeners waiting for the doors to open at 5 pm."

WUMR Music Director Malvin Massey chimes in, "It was just what Jazz fans in Memphis have been looking for, modern

and sleek yet just down home enough to make you feel comfortable. What a great Memphis Jazz family we have. Thanks to everybody for helping to prove that Jazz has a solid home in Memphis...we can't wait to do it again."

Garry Goin, EP Delta Kitchen director of entertainment, put together a solid lineup, which in addition to Whalum included Voodoo Village, Sal Crocker, University of Memphis Director of Jazz studies Jack Cooper, and Goin himself. The revenue generated from the event allowed WUMR to reach a new record Radiothon total of just under \$20,000.

"We're thrilled to keep taking the total a notch higher each time, and we are grateful to our loyal listeners and the University of Memphis for supporting the station and helping it continue to grow in popularity while keeping its niche as the only station in the Memphis area to offer that Classic Jazz sound," Bialek said.
